Integration Measures and Advocacy for Undocumented Migrants (IMAS)

The impact of GCR's key- work and key-activities that have been funded *i.a.* through EPIM [note that the major GCR's funding comes from ERF] is:

- Adoption of advanced law provisions by GCR's participation in consultations for drafting, comments and reviews before getting adopted regulations regarding asylum procedure, i.e. PD 114/2010, where a second interview and safeguards of fair procedure have been provided; regarding reception of migrants flows and returning of illegally staying migrants, i.e. L 3907/2011, where first time a holistic approach of migration issue -reception, asylum procedure, return- and clause of legalization for humanitarian reasons; regarding UM minors' rights safeguarding that they are actually protected regardless their status –legally or illegally staying in Greece PD 220/2007.
- Providing final beneficiaries with:
 - legal assistance [consultation of failed asylum seekers and UM, communication for access to asylum procedure, court proceedings for failed asylum applications, motions for release detained UM etc]: ~ 7664 UM
 - health [referral to public hospitals, referral to other NGOs for health issues, psychologist support etc]: ~298 UM
 - education [providing Greek lessons, referral to other NGOs providing Greek lessons, facilitating access to public schools]: ~ 1210
 - housing [referral to reception centers mostly minors and families in priority]: ~176
 - information about their social rights and referral to work positions: ~ 286
- Increased public awareness regarding GCR and its activity because of GCR's better understanding of using media tools and co-operating with migrants' communities => more presence in media and social media and advanced website.
